
You will need:

- A4 white paper
- A5 coloured paper
- Pencils, crayons or pens
- Ruler
- Scissors
- Glue


Step 1:

Think of a pair of four letter words you can illustrate. **Your words could be**; food, drink, colours, plants, the weather, animals, transport, an action, characters, clothing or hobbies, but should only be **four letters or less**, for example:

Blue Sky, Warm Sun, Grey Rain, High Hill, Sly Fox, Mad Dog, Frog King, Busy Bee, Lazy Cat, Good Brew, Tall Cake, Pop Art, Land Ahoy or Big




Here are some other words that you could pair together and illustrate



Step 2: Write your chosen words here:





Take a piece of **A5 coloured paper** and **measure 6 cm up from the base of the short edge**. Draw a pencil line across where you have measured, this is where you will **write your second word**.

Fold the paper in to quarters lengthways then re-open the paper. Write the letters of your second word in each panel.



Now draw your image above each letter, making it move in every step.









Cut the paper along the folds so you have four separate strips.

Step 3:

Take the A4 white paper and measure 6 cm down from the top of the long edge and draw a pencil line, this is where you will write your first word. Fold the paper in half lengthways, keep folding in half, 3 times in total until the paper is divided in to eight strips, then open it out again.








Starting from the second strip on the left stick the coloured strips of paper alternatively on to the white piece of paper, making sure they are in the correct order. You should now have stripy paper. Write your first word in the separate panels along the top line on the white parts of the paper.







Step 4:

Fold the whole sheet of paper again along the original folds, this time as a **concertina**, this will make the paper **zig zag**.





Look to the right and you will see your first word then look from the left and the second word with your illustrations will be revealed!





Extra hints and tips:

- o Draw your letters using different styles to help describe the words, such as long and thin, bubble or block lettering.
- o Colour in and decorate the drawing to help bring the illustrations to life.
- o Try illustrating both words, the first half of the story will only be on the white strips and the second will be on the coloured strips.
- o REMEMBER to have fun!
