

Recommended Primary Books Autumn Term 2024




Bilan, Jasbinder Nush and the Stolen Emerald

Nush is the maharani of an Indian kingdom in Victorian times. The British East India Company has taken land and an emerald the size of an apple, which has cultural importance. When her father decides to take her twin brother to England to see Queen Victoria, she is disappointed and plans to go instead. Her father's aim is to help the political situation by talking to Queen Victoria, whereas Nush wants the emerald back as it is so important to their culture.

A compelling historical adventure story and a well written mystery. Nush is a wonderful main character and intelligent and strong. Great feeling of time and place.




Chadda, Sarwat Tariq and the Drowning City

When Tariq begins to have terrifying visions of a tidal wave destroying the city, no-one believes him and he is arrested. But, he then makes two unlikely friends in Livia a young inventor and Artos a young city guard. Together they go on a dangerous search for the long-lost elemental World's Egg Spiritstone which Tariq believes will save the city and his clan. But, will they find it and be able to use it in time to save everyone?

Exciting quest adventure with a very strong undercurrent message of human impact on the environment. The three main characters are well drawn, and there is plenty of adventure and jeopardy to keep reader's engaged. Good start to this new leisure reading trilogy.




An exciting and compelling adventure story which is short and easy to read, with plenty of twists and turns in the plot.

Montgomery, Ross Porky Pies



A rollicking read and good fun with lots of puns throughout and short text with colour illustrations. Perfect for emergent readers.




O'Leary, Dermot Wings of Glory

Super adventure tale with plenty of daring-do and engaging characters. Good leisure read, but could support a WW2 history topic as well.




Pearson, Jenny Shipwrecked

A romp of a story with some funny and surreal episodes, and lots of twists and turns in the plot. Good leisure read.




Povey, Clare The Wanderdays: Journey to Fantome Island



Thorpe, Ashley The Boy to Beat the Gods

Kayode dreams of eating the forbidden fruit of the Orishas, so he can gain power and stop the gods who terrorise his people. When a fruit appears in front of him he leaps on it. He joins forces with a shapeshifting trickster god and a vengeful princess to save his sister, but his power won't last for ever. It's a story of one boy versus six gods. Exciting fantasy inspired by West African Yoruba mythology. Set in pre-colonial Nigeria and inspired by the author's ancestry.
